

What is a Comprehensive Plan?




A comprehensive plan is a **guiding document** that outlines how a city's longterm vision for **land development** will be
implemented over time.

It answers three big questions:

- 1. Where are we now?
- 2. Where do we want to go?
- 3. How do we get there?


The Role of a Comprehensive Plan



2020 Comprehensive Plan Future Land Use Map

- Guides future land use and development decisions in Fairburn
- Provides direction for related elements (housing, transportation, etc.)
- Sets long-term vision for the City's future

Our Process




What Are We Doing?




- Take inventory of what the City of Fairburn has accomplished since the last comprehensive plan was adopted in 2020.
- Update the City's future land use strategy.
- Audit the Zoning Ordinance and make recommendations to align it better with the Comprehensive Plan recommendations.

What Are We Doing?











- Update the plan to reflect the results of recent planning studies
- Create a work program and action plan to implement the vision.
- Get input from the community on what they want to see for Fairburn's future.

Accomplishments

- Highway 74 expansion
- Completion of the Parks Master Plan and implementing some of those recommendations
- Updating the Economic Development Strategic Plan
- Placemaking initiatives
- Upgrades to the concert series
- Fire Station 24 is complete and operating
- Fire Station 23 is nearing completion (85%)

Needs

Economic Revitalization: Address declining property values, business closures, and stagnant growth.

Infrastructure: Improve aging roads, sidewalks, drainage, and connectivity.

Housing: Expand senior housing, mixed-use developments, and affordable housing options.

Land Use & Zoning: Update zoning codes, prevent incompatible uses, and encourage smart growth.

Downtown & Corridor Redevelopment: Revitalize underutilized properties and improve walkability.

Needs

Parks & Recreation: Increase park acreage, recreational facilities, and trail connectivity.

Transportation: Enhance sidewalks, bike lanes, transit access, and truck management.

Placemaking & Public Spaces: Strengthen public gathering spaces, creative placemaking, and wayfinding.

Economic Development: Improve business attraction, branding, and flexibility in property use.

Sustainability: Preserve greenspace, improve tree canopy protection, and manage industrial impacts.

Opportunities

Redevelopment Potential: Downtown, on major corridors, and on underutilized properties

Existing Economic Development Tools: Opportunity zones, tax incentives, and public-private partnerships

Public Infrastructure Investments: Recent streetscape improvements, expanded parks, and new multimodal connections

Housing Growth: New demand for senior, workforce, and mixed-use housing near key areas

Opportunities

Creative Placemaking: Existing public art, cultural programming, and historic preservation efforts

Industrial Growth: Leverage Fairburn's industrial base and location near major transportation hubs


Tourism & Events: Utilize the Renaissance Festival, film industry, and local historic assets

Education & Workforce: Expand partnerships with colleges and workforce training programs.
